Well done Livs!

In the last newsletter we featured our amazing youngsters and how they progress through the band structure. This time we have another great success story to report. Olivia (Livs) Needham started playing cornet with the Training Band when she was eight years old. She then moved on to Concert Brass playing both cornet and flugelhorn before going to Sheffield University to pursue a music degree. Dad Mark initially helped out at Training Band before joining Concert Brass where he's played cornet, including soprano cornet and flugelhorn before returning to B flat cornet.

As one of her final projects Livs has composed a piece for brass band called Feminista. Dave Newman arranged for the Senior Band to play it culminating in it being recorded on 29 May. Livs said, "Feminista is based on a piece of art with the same title, and therefore the composition is reflects the painting's structure, shapes and colour." Livs, who also plays piano and sings, completed her degree two months ago, graduating officially in July.



Livs said, "I absolutely loved the opportunities that came out of the various musical societies such as musical directing shows as well as composing for departmental groups like the new music ensemble. My final portfolio, that contains this brass band piece, got an award for the best composition portfolio in the year so I was very chuffed with that, if a little shocked!

I am now working for the Sheffield Music Hub which is the local music service, in the admin team and getting stuck into the various bits and bobs that they do there. I'm loving it so far and looking forward to getting into it even more when the kids go back to school in September."

And the Return of Proms in the Park



Hathern's Big Week returned in June - this time the Big Platinum Jubilee Week. It kicked off with the Training Band sections having an open rehearsal in the marquee on Monday, and ended with Proms in the Park featuring the Senior Band and the Loughborough Theatre Choir. The weather was damp and cold so the party was held inside the marquee. The concert celebrated music from the 70 years of the Queen's reign, and kicked off with Barwick Green. If you don't recognise the name, there's a good chance that you'll know the music as it is the signature tune to the radio soap, The Archers. The piece was written by Arthur Wood in 1924 and has been the Archers theme since it was first broadcast a year before the Queen's accession to the throne. Incidentally it was Billy Connolly who suggested that it should be our national anthem as he felt God Save the Queen was too dull.

James Bond featured twice in the programme, firstly with the theme composed by John Barry and then with Adele's Skyfall. Andrew Lloyd-Webber also had two entries in the chart - Jesus Christ Superstar and Love Changes Everything. We had the Beatles' Ticket to Ride and David Bowie's Life on Mars. Wallace and Gromit got a look in with A Grand Day out, and no celebration of decades of television music could omit the theme from Dr. Who.

The band's numbers were interspersed with songs from the choir. We had a Queen medley and Ben Hardy, gave us Cliff Richard's Move It. Julie Easter sang Shirley Bassey's Kiss me Honey, Honey Kiss Me and, anticipating Lulu's live performance at Wicked Hathern Fest in August, Laura Hardy gave a knockout rendition of Shout. At the end of the first half the band and choir combined to perform Willy Russell's Tell Me It's Not True from the musical Blood Brothers.

As usual, the concert ended with the standard Last Night of the Proms numbers with accompanying flag waving. However this year, Elgar was followed by the theme of 2022 - Neil Diamond's Sweet Caroline performed by band and choir - and audience!
